BRONCO NATION: SY 19 /20 QUICK REFERENCE DISCIPLINE SHEET

ID Cards – All students must wear ID cards at all times while on campus.

- **First ID is free.** Replacement ID's \$5.00 (Purchase in the Library)
- Students can charge up to 3 ID Cards; must pay cash after 3rd ID
- Students without an ID card

(Consequences range from Saturday School to suspension)

Dress Code – All students must be in compliance with the district dress code.

Consequences: First offense Saturday School / Correct dress code issue

Next offense: AC/ISS (In School Suspension)

- Hats may not be worn /carried in the building ***(store in locker or book bag)***
- All dresses, skirts and shorts worn must be no shorter than fingertip length.
- Hoods may not be worn on campus.
- Spandex, tights, leggings / jeggings, and yoga style clothing will be allowed only if they are worn under pants, shorts, skorts, dresses, and skirts that are at least fingertip length all the way around.
- No sagging; pants pulled up to your waist. Under garments must not be visible.
- Non-natural hair colors are acceptable. Hair must be neat and clean.
- Holes or frayed material in jeans or pants must not be above fingertip length.
- No tube tops, halter tops or spaghetti straps.
- Students will not wear clothing with pictures, emblems, or writing that is lewd, offensive, suggestive, vulgar, or obscene, or that advertises or depicts tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs, pornography or any other prohibited substance.
- Items of apparel, jewelry, or grooming that are considered extreme in dress (including clothing that is torn, cut, ragged or with holes) or that advertise illegal substances or alcohol or that could be associated with gang related activities will not be worn.
- Headbands, bandannas, and gang related apparel will not be worn on campus.

- Students will wear shoes. Any shoes not considered safe should not be worn to school. House shoes/slippers may not be worn. (Shoes with cleats or wheels may not be worn.)
- The principal and event's coach or sponsor will determine athletic attire, including cheerleading and drill team outfits, in order to meet length and appropriate size rules.
- No visible body piercing will be allowed with the exception of the ears and one single piercing on the face. Campus principals determine if and where clear spacers may be worn.

Electronics – Cell phones may only be used in the cafeteria. Headphones and earphones also may only be used in the cafeteria.

- Cell phones will be confiscated if students use them in a classroom or any place on campus other than the cafeteria.
- Do not attempt to remove the air-watch APP from your IPAD.

Drop off / Pick up – Busses will pick up after school and drop off before school in the back of the building. School will dismiss at 2:55PM, and students need to get to the bus stop by 3:02PM to ride the bus. **Parents may pick non-bus riding students up in the front of the building.**

Bus schedule information: Log onto the MISD website for information on schedules (pick-up locations and bus numbers) Click on to the parent link and then click the bus route locator. Type in your address and student's name: this will tell you everything you need to know.

Leaving campus during the school day – Students are not allowed to leave campus during the school day. Once a student arrives on campus they are required to stay on campus for the entire length of their schedule. Reasons to leave are very limited and include such things as course work at Ben Barber, TCC classes, special work/educational programs, appointments (signed out by parent/guardian) and early release for students. Students who leave campus for any other reason other will be subject to discipline consequences (*In school suspension, loss of parking privileges for 6 weeks, Out of school suspension and loss of exemptions*).

2019 - 2020 Student Dress and Grooming

(All Grade Levels) Revised May 2018

Shirts & Tops

- Halter, tube, and tank tops, as well as tops with large armholes and muscle shirts are not allowed. Additionally, all shirts/blouses/tops must cover cleavage, the entire back, and midriff. The middle section (midriff) of the body must be covered at all times including during reasonable movement. Tops that are sleeveless must measure 2 inches or more across the shoulders. Transparent and/or see-through material is considered unacceptable unless worn over another article of clothing that meets dress code.
- Layering of shirts or tops is acceptable provided the combination of clothing meets the above standards throughout the school day.
- Students will not wear clothing with pictures, emblems, or writing that is lewd, offensive, suggestive, vulgar, obscene, or that advertises or depicts tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs, pornography, or any other prohibited items.
- Any clothing, accessories, symbols, jewelry, or paraphernalia that depicts or suggests association with a gang, criminal organization, or secret society shall not be worn or brought to school or in any way be present at any school-sponsored event.
- Appropriately sized coats and jackets may be worn to school, but campus administration may require the item to be stored in the student's lockers.

Pants, Dresses, Skirts, Skorts, & Shorts

- Jeans and pants with holes or frayed material, which reveals any area of skin or undergarments above fingertip length, are considered inappropriate.
- Pants, shorts, skorts, and skirts that do not fit at the waistline are inappropriate. No sagging is allowed.
- Spandex, tights, leggings / jeggings, and yoga style clothing will be allowed only if they are worn under pants, shorts, skorts, dresses, and skirts that are fingertip length front and back all the way around.
- Dresses, skirts, skorts, and shorts length must measure fingertip length front to back all the way around while sitting and standing.
- Dresses, skirts, skorts, and shorts length must be measured from the top of the slit.

- Pajamas, bathrobes, and or sleepwear are not allowed. Underwear, muscle shirts, half shirts, or any other clothing similar to undergarments may not be visible.
- Sliding/Biking/Compression shorts may not be worn unless covered by dress code approved shorts.

Accessories

The following may not be worn during the school day:

- Any type of head covering to include: caps, hats, berets, head scarfs (unless for medical or religious reasons), hoods (hoodie), Du rags, kerchiefs, or visors.
- Sunglasses (unless medical documentation or administrator approval is provided).
- Blankets or throws.
- Bandannas (as a head covering or headband).
- Ear muffs.
- Visible piercings with the exception of the ears and one single piercing on the face.
- Any accessories, symbols, jewelry, tattoos, or paraphernalia, which depicts or suggests association with a gang, secret society/fraternity, inappropriate or derogatory language, racism, or sexual connotations and or deemed distracting.
- Chains or wallets with chains.
- Spiked jewelry.
- Any shoes that aren't considered safe (cleats, shoes with wheels, house or slippers/shoes).
- Mouth accessories to include: "grillz" or Dracula teeth.
- Eye contacts that are cat eyes or Halloween/costume style contacts.
- Costumes (unless approved by a school organized activity).
- Hair that causes a health or safety hazard and or a disruption of the school environment.

Campus Administration has final judgment on whether or not a student is in compliance with the dress code.
